PASTOR'S MOMENT-FEBRUARY

It may be impossible to believe but the Season of Lent begins at the end of February this year. Wild Geese by Mary Oliver

A LITTLE HISTORY FROM OUR HISTORIAN

A number of people have asked about the Avery Memorial window. Here is some history gleaned from our church records and from other sources.

When planning for the memorial window, the church fathers considered designs submitted by a few different companies. They chose the Church Glass and Decorating Co. of New York. This company was founded in 1899 by Edward Peck Sperry and Russell Foot. Sperry was formerly with the Tiffany Glass Company and one of its most celebrated designers. He left Tiffany in 1898. Sperry's new company continued to design but they did not construct. Construction was generally commissioned to the Calvert and Kimberly Co of New York. Both Oliver Kimberly and Thomas Calvert had also worked for the Tiffany Glass and Decorating Co. but had also left in 1898. Our beautiful window appears listed in their 1904-1905 catalogue as "The Avery Memorial Window in The Avery Memorial Church, Groton, Conn."!

Unfortunately, the Church Glass and Decorating Co. had a practice of not signing their windows or including their artists in copyright petitions, which often led to misattributions in their day as well as now. They worked specifically in opalescent stained glass and are often compared to designs and work of Tiffany Studios.

Our records show the estimated cost of the Avery Window to be \$2000.00. Our records also show the final cost to be \$2020.50. We paid Church Glass and Decorating Co. a total of \$1800.00. An additional \$215.00 was extended to the Ecclesiastical Society for mullions, tracery, etc. Programs and Invitations were an additional \$5.50. A total of \$2020.50.

Not much this day in age for a magnificent creation that can inspire, delight and warm our hearts with its beauty.


