I have no idea what the next weeks or even months will look like but know that we are working hard to provide prayer meetings and worship services. Our plan so far for the month of April is for me to tape a worship service from my home and we are looking into adding videos of hymns and messages for our children. We will post them each week on our website and Facebook page, as well as putting them on UTube for all to watch. We will email out the bulletin with hymns during the week prior. I will keep you posted if that changes. I will do my best to offer Zoom Prayer Meetings during the week and am hoping to have a special Zoom worship meeting on Maundy Thursday (possibly with everyone providing their own communion elements, whether its bread and wine or a cookie and a cup of milk!), a visual Good Friday meditation, and special music for Easter Sunday. If we can get the entire congregation on Zoom, we will worship through that method as it will connect us in a more significant way.

Please keep in touch through email or calls and let us know if you need anything. Please let us know if you or a loved one is ill and/or in the hospital. Connie Stoddard, our Parish Visitor and I will be checking in with our shut-ins and those in need of pastoral care.

And continue to pray for one another. Here is a prayer to read with taking those seven deep breaths each day. We will get through this.





STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Stewardship is about recognizing blessings and managing them well"

It happens out of sight, out of mind – pledges, that is, not our church family!

There isn't one among us that isn't or hasn't been affected, in some way, with the current directive to socially distance ourselves. Church families are not exempt. It was certainly strange not attending Thursday choir rehearsal or driving to 162 Monument Street on Sunday. Maybe for you it was missing bible study or a committee meeting.

So, what can you do to continue the work of the church while not being there in body? You can continue with your stewardship pledge.

The SNEUCC passed along an interesting statistic: over 84% of individual donations to a congregation come in through the offering plate on a Sunday, in person. *Eighty-four percent*. That's a lot. Currently, we aren't in the physical church on Sunday, so that 84% is significant. Everyone worked so hard to develop a budget that alleviates the need for a draw-down on our investments. It's so very important to keep operating in this way and that we do not get behind. We humbly ask that members of our church family do what you can to consistently continue with your pledges.

The physical presence of being in the church building has been my personal reminder to have my weekly pledge ready to put in the collection plate; maybe it was yours. And so now we have to create a new reminder – because the work of the church goes on even when we're not there. This includes, but is not limited to, the work of our church minister and staff.

Here are a few suggestions:

- Create a calendar reminder to mail your pledge to the church. You might even be in a position to make future pledge payments go for it!
- Set-up autopay. Our Treasurer, Gay Lambert, can provide the specifics. Her email address is Treasurer@grotoncongregational.org, or call the church (860-445-7409) and leave a message for her to give you a call and she can relay the procedure. You won't miss a week!
- When you're watching Pastor Joan's online sermons and/or messages, imagine yourself sitting in the sanctuary. The offertory is announced, and you hear the music begin (we really are working on making this happen!). The plate comes to you and you graciously place in your pledge. This can be your reminder to mail your offering.
- If you have another way of reminding, share it!

As you transmit your pledge in whatever way works for you, keep in mind that the Deacon's Fund can always use donations.

Borrowing from the SNEUCC's article, your Stewardship Committee shares the following:

"Our faith is about more than buildings. Even if we must be apart from one another in body, we can still connect, inspire, support, care, and love each other. Social dissonance does not mean spiritually separate. Together, we can find ways to hold each other's hearts. And in time, our doors will open again, and we will reach out in welcome."
